Learning Outcomes	<p>Upon completion of this course,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students will have gained information about the historical and cultural heritage of the island of Cyprus. They will have gained information about flora and fauna endemic to Cyprus. They will have learned about the geographical location and topographic structure of Cyprus. They will be able to better comprehend how the cultural and social structure of the island where they will spend most of their lives during their university education has been shaped over the centuries. They will have understood the importance of cultural approaches and investigations that differ from those conducted during high school education. 				
Course Description	Being able to comparatively analyse the variable dynamics of Cyprus across the ages also brings with it an understanding of the dynamics of the Mediterranean basin. Having information about the island of Cyprus and the Mediterranean culture provides us with an opportunity to understand and describe the states established in the Mediterranean, the religious communities operating there, and the socio-cultural interactions between people. This course offers the opportunity to examine in depth the social, economic and cultural dynamics of Cyprus, which acts as a bridge between East and West.
